Does growing competition in the documentary film industry result in a growing number of quality documentaries? Is this the right documentary market model? Is there an alternative to the sometimes extremely stressful process? Where pitching art is more important than the art of pitching? In a non-competitive atmosphere, without the stress of 'winning', in a 'slow ptich' mood? This year's edition of ZagrebDox Pro event is trying to find answers to these particular questions. Over the course of five days, four mentors - Nebojša Slijepčević, Ana Fernandez Saiz Tue Steen Muller and Jeva Ubele – will fully focus on eight projects and their authors. The awards of this year's Pro edition - Al Jazeera Balkans financial support, London-based Impronta Films advisory award amd RAFF - Rab Film Festival residential award - additionally stress commitment to the selected projects even after the closure of this programme.

THE FOG OF TRUTH – AI AND DOX

At its core, documentary filmmaking seeks truth. With Al's rise, this quest grows complex. Can generative AI deepen artistic truth or erode audience trust? Recognizing this challenge, the American Archival Producers Alliance issued quidelines to uphold documentary journalism values. ZagrebDox PRO explores Al's creative potential and ethical challenges. Originator of the idea is Nenad Puhovski, concept creator Morana Komlienović, and Artefacto is carried out under the initiative Travelling Docs in collaboration with the Creative Europe MEDIA Desks in Belgium (Wallonia Brussels), Croatia, Czech Republic, Denmark, Estonia, Finland, Germany (Berlin, Hamburg, Munich, NRW), Greece, Hungary, Italy (Torino), Latvia, Norway, Portugal, Slovenia and Sweden, while PUBLIKUM in collaboration with the Creative Europe MEDIA Desk Croatia.

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ANA FERNANDEZ SAIZ

NEBOJŠA SLIJEPČEVIĆ

Nebojša Slijepčević is a film director based in Zagreb, Croatia. He has directed numerous documentaries and short fiction films. His short fiction film *The Man Who Could Not Remain Silent* won the Palme d'Or for Best Short Film at the 2024 Cannes Film Festival, European Film Award and Cesar for Best Short film, and it was nominated for Oscar. His most acclaimed documentary, Srbenka, has won over 20 festival awards and was shortlisted for the European Film Awards. Nebojša also works as a creative producer for documentary films at Zagreb Film production company.

TUE STEEN MÜLLER

Tue Steen Müller is a documentary consultant and critic from Denmark. He worked with documentary films for more than 20 years at the Danish Film Board, as press officer, festival representative and film consultant/commissioner. He is co-founder of Balticum Film and TV Festival, Filmkontakt Nord, Documentary of the EU and European Documentary Network, where from 1996 until 2005 he was the first director. From 2006 he is a freelance consultant and teacher in many workshops, as well as programme consultant for the festivals Magnificent7 in Belgrade, DOCSBarcelona, Message2Man in St. Petersburg and DOKLeipzig. He received multiple awards for his contribution to the Danish and European documentary culture. In 2019 he received a Big Stamp at the 15th edition of ZagrebDox. He teaches at the ZeLIG.

IEVA ÜBELE

Throughout her career, leva has produced numerous documentaries and photo exhibitions exploring social and environmental issues. In 2019. she founded her own production company Baltic Balkan Productions, producing and co-producing films that center on compelling personal narratives and urgent social topics. Alongside her work as a producer, she is currently developing her debut documentary film as a director. In 2020-2023 she worked as Head of Industry programme at Beldocs IDFF (Belgrade, Serbia). Ieva is also a tutor at documentary film workshops, including AGORA Boost (Thessaloniki IDFF), BDC Discoveries, and ESoDoc. An alumna of EURODOC. Emerging Producers and EAVE and a member of the Documentary Association of Europe and EWA - the European Women's Audiovisual Network.

Robert Tomić Zuber is a journalist, director and a producer who has more than twenty years of experience working as a journalist and editor in the Croatian press, on radio and on television, as well as working for international media like the BBC. At the Station in Pula (2001), Accidental Son (2008), Mila Seeking Senida (2010) awarded with the Human Rights Award at Sarajevo Film Festival, Million Dollar Life (2017). From 2013 - 2016 he was Head of Documentary Production on Croatian national television. Today he is a freelancer, and owner of a production house TOROlab, and lecturer at Zagreb's faculty of Vern. He is founder and director of RAFF -Rab Film Festival in Croatia.

A nurse told him there was a certain vaccine that makes fear go away. And it did, but after a while, Farshad realized that the anti-fear vaccine was just morphine, and he had become an addict. Post-war, he moved to Japan, gained fame via a documentary, married, and had children. His secret addiction led to divorce. Back in Iran, he seeks his estranged daughter online, haunted by the war. The film explores his life and enduring desire for reunion.

Jafar Najafi was born in 1986 in Koohrang, studied cinema at Tehran University of Art. He directed the award-winning documentary short Asho in 2019, which won the Best Children's Documentary Award at IDFA and received Honorable Mention at DOK Leipzig. In 2021, his documentary Make-Up Artist won the IDFA FIPRESCI Award and the Award of Excellence at Yamagata. His documentary Alone premiered at the Venice Biennale in 2022 and won Best Documentary at Serbia Doc Russia International Documentary Film Festival in 2024.

Petko is cameraman and director of numerous awarded documentaries. His latest documentary Kalin and the Jail Team was the first Bulgarian documentary bought and released on Netflix.

No Offence is a feature-length documentary set in Međimurje, the smallest and northernmost county in Croatia, where a unique coexistence unfolds. Croatians, Roma, and Nepalese live in complete separation, yet their unresolved conflicts create a neverending cycle of discrimination. The film was developed as a master's project at the Academy of Dramatic Art in Zagreb and is currently in post-production.

Lucija Marčec graduated with an MA in Journalism at the Faculty of Political Science in Zagreb. She worked as a journalist in television and online media, which led her into the world of film. Her focus is documentary film, and she is currently finishing a master's degree in Documentary Directing at the Academy of Dramatic Art in Zagreb, where she directed two short films.

The basic tools I would use to visualize this would be the family archive of Super 8 films (about four hours of various material), photographs, and newly filmed material from the present time. Through the frames (people, places, events...) passing through the scanner, new sequences of the film would emerge, freezing time and impressions that I only vaguely remember today but which, consciously or unconsciously, shaped who I am now.

Mladen Ćapin was born in Karlovac, Croatia. He graduated from college with majors in history and philosophy. Since 2000, he has been working as a screenwriter and director in the documentary department of HRT. He is the author of about fifty documentary programs and films produced by HTV. Most of his work is related to social and psychological stories and depictions of ordinary people, their occupations, passions and destinies. He has also directed music and sports documentaries, screen adaptations of literary works, and documentary essays.
